1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Seamans called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

5. PETITIONS, PRESENTATIONS & DELEGATIONS

a. Presentation of Certificate of Volunteer Appreciation - Ross MacKay

Mayor Seamans and Suptintendent Critchlow presented Ross MacKay with a Volunteer Recognition Certificate for his time and effort served on the RCMP Codiac Regional Policing Authority.

Presentation by Paul Belliveau, Vice-chair of the Board of Directors - Big Brothers Big Sisters

Update of activities

Paul Belliveau, Vice-Chair of the Board of Directors provided a brief history of how Big Brothers Big Sisters came into existence. He noted that the Moncton Chapters started in early 70s. Its main goal was to accompany a young boy or girl in giving them advice which would to enable the acquisition of good values and habits.

An independent study shows that every \$1 invested in BBBS would amount to a decrease in social costs of \$16. P. Belliveau outlined the different programs that are currently offered

Outlined different programs - twimming/or matching; big couple and big family, mentoring program through schools - biggest challenge is acquiring volunteers.

He noted that one of the biggest drawback is the lack of big brothers. There is a lack of awareness about the organization and there continues to be a need form human and financial support.

P. Bellieveau remarked that funding comes annually which puts a strain on its programs. What is being proposed of the tri-communities is a multi year financial commitment of 3-5 years which would provide financial stability.

Mayor Seamans commented that she has heard first hand from one of our staff, Meghan Cross, who has been a Big Sister for many years and speaks highly of the organization.

The Deputy Clerk confirmed that there are different financial options and a process to be followed. She indicated that she would work with Mr. Belliveau to determine the best course of action.

CC - update on programs. Received any commitment from the other communities. Have made one other presentation.

Deputy Mayor Rampersaud - thank their team. do tremendous work with our youth. Coming from a place of not only love but need. She wanted to Clarify the "ask".

P. Belliveau confirmed that the request for support is \$7500 per year.
