

- Revenue for that year was \$1600+
- Year 2017 Riverview Town Council gave \$200 also providing again permission to use the path and Chocolate River Station to set up
- With partnership with Sobeys
- After buying T-shirts and medals revenue of \$1500

Funding this year

- We are looking to use the money for media promotion, help with posters as well as an add in the local paper. The media aspects will get us more coverage which is hopeful to attract more people to Riverview to help support the Special Olympics. We are also hoping for the facilities again.
- Hoping for \$1000 from the Town Council during our third year.




Building Communities


Changing Attitudes
