 The Chief has reviewed the structural report diagrams. He will be meeting with the consultants to write a tender to start the work this spring.

EMO

- The final drafts of the "Emergency Preparedness for Seniors" and "Are your Pets Ready for an Emergency" EMO Pamphlets are currently under review. We hope to have them to the printer by the end of April.
- The Chief presented an EMO Presentation to the Lion's Club on the 18th Mar 2017. The topic included Emergency preparedness, past storms lesson learned and who to keep track of a storm following the town social media sites.

Training

Regular in-house volunteer training sessions, topics covered:

- Respectful Workplace with Sally Wells
- Ice Rescue awareness training
- Total of 75 hrs of personnel training

Voluntary training hours with volunteer firefighters:

- Medical First Responder Course in progress
- Total of 91 hrs of personnel training

Recruit volunteer training sessions, topics covered:

- RFR Task Log Book (MAYDAY procedure, RIT Pak Orientation, Q-12 Creeper Controls)
- Total of 18 hrs of personnel training (60% complete)

Regular In-house training sessions with career firefighting crews, topics covered:

- Knots and hoisting equipment
- Reading Smoke
- Total of 38 hrs of personnel training

Certifications Obtained:

- Five firefighters and two Chief Officers were recertified as Blue Card Incident Commanders.
- Five career firefighters obtained their Swift Water Rescue Awareness certification.
- Total of 110 hrs of personnel training

Fire Inspections

• There were twelve fire safety inspections conducted in February, eight for annual licensing. Occupancies included: eight daycares, two assembly occupancies, and two apartment buildings.
