Section 3: Other Notable Development & Highlights for Council's Attention

## **Staff Development**

**April 16/17**: Both full time Aquatic staff attended the 2<sup>nd</sup> Canadian Red Cross Atlantic Swimposium. The 2 day event included keynote speakers from across Canada and several certification courses in Water Safety and Instructor Development. A large number of supervisory staff from around the Maritimes attended to discuss common trends and challenges in the aquatic industry.

**April 28**: PCMAC will be hosting a regional Aquafitness Instructor workshop in partnership with Fitness NB and AQX-Training Programs. The workshop will see 12-15 instructors from across Atlantic Canada use PCMAC for professional development and recertification.

**April 27:** Both full time aquatic employees will be attending the Lifesaving Society of NB's 51<sup>st</sup> AGM, where they will be accepting an award on behalf of the town: "Largest Lifesaving Program in the Province for a Municipality under 20,000 Residents" for 2018. Scoring is point based and relates to participation in swimming lessons and certification courses delivered.
