Activities in Public Works:

- Crews continue to monitor streets and filling potholes with hot mix asphalt or cold patch as needed.
- Most water main breaks have been patched with the asphalt recycler.
- The parking lot at the aquatic centre has been looked after as best we can.
- All Sidewalks and paved trails have been swept clean. The street sweeper will be cleaning streets starting on April 15 and continue for the next 6 weeks.
- Crews will begin to inspect and repair street signs during the week of April 15.
- The winter evening and night shifts are done for the season and employees have returned to the regular day shift.
- Watermain flushing will commence the week of April 23 from 8am to 9pm and continue for 4 weeks. Public notices will be sent out in advance.
- The temporary water pipe installation for Weir and Berkley will start the week of April 29.
- Line painting will start in early May, weather permitting.
- Repairs to lawns from the winter operations will start as soon as top soil becomes available which could be a little late this year (early May) unless the weather improves.
