There does not seem to be any major concerns.</p> <p>External ladder testing completed on Quint 13. Some issues were found. It has been put on restricted use for now. Parts are on order and it should be fully serviceable by early September.</p>

	<p>The new Training Safety Plan as been adopted by the Fire Department. This document will be produced for all high hazard training such as; swift water rescue, live fire training, etc...</p> <p>New Fit Test Machine has been selected by an in-house committee and has been ordered. Should arrive by mid-September.</p> <p>Volunteer Fire Fighter recruitment has commenced. The hiring process should be completed by mid-September.</p> <p>The Chief had a meeting with the town EMO Committee and the Emergency Operations Center mid-August. This meeting discussed the current status of our EMO and a future provincial exercise in Oct 2019.</p>
