Section 2: Status of Department's Operational Priorities for 2022

Priority	Status
Administration	 TMR radio project stalled by supply chain issues (parts from Motorola Radio). Delivery of backordered parts now scheduled for August 5th. Implementation meetings with Bell continue. Operational Review Committee generated and reviewed several reports generated from the CAD system related to response times and staffing apparatus.
Operations	 Truck committee took a trip to Harrisburg PA to do research on apparatus and meet several vendors to discuss options. The members who went found the trip extremely educational.

	 May has been a month of maintenance. From having tires put back on the ATV and UTV for summer operations to safety inspections and maintenance on the fleet vehicles. The projected total call volume for 2022 is 1,452 calls. This would be a total increase of 426 calls. This has created some additional costs in terms of overtime, fuel, etc.
Training	 A total of 173.25 recorded training hours for the month of May. In house training topics included: Core firefighter Level 1 skills; Firefighter rapid intervention skills; Rescue drags and carries; Blue Card Incident Command for commercial buildings. Twelve career firefighters and one volunteer firefighter participated in a live fire training session at the training area on Niagara Rd. On May 28th, approximately forty firefighters from the Southeast Firefighters Association (SEFFA) attended training at Riverview Fire and Rescue and the Moncton Fire Department. Students used training facilities at the Riverview fire station, and at the Niagara Rd. training area. Two Riverview instructors participated along with five of our firefighters.
Fire Prevention & Education Report	 Three apartment buildings inspected. One Fire safety Plan completed. Three Fire Pit inspections completed. Three commercial building pre-plans completed and added to FireQ. Acting Fire Inspector Denis Pleau finished his time with Riverview Fire and Rescue at the end of May. His duties will be assumed by the new Deputy Chief of Fire Prevention. We thank Denis Pleau for his continued service to the organization.
