Section 2: Status of Department's Operational Priorities for 2022

| Priority | Status |

| Administration | TMR radio project is moving ahead. Equipment has been received, and implementation meetings with Bell continue. Projected implementation is early October. Operational Review Committee work is complete. Report is now being written. |
| Operations | Geoffrey Fisher assumed the position of Deputy Chief of Operations on August 15, 2022. Two new SOGs were drafted to assist with on scene decontamination and improve firefighter safety. The second gives guideline to the number of uniforms issued to a firefighter. New auto extrication tools purchased through the 2022 Capital budget are now in service aboard three fire apparatus. This extends our coverage in instances of multiple MVC calls. |
| Training | Multiple training sessions were held in August with career firefighters covering tactics in apartment buildings that have a built-in stand-pipe system. This will be a focus for improvement in equipment and training in 2023. |

- In June, a total of 180 total training hours were recorded. Training topics included: rope rescue, introduction of Pelvic Binders (medical training), live fire training (conducted in Riverview), and apartment building pre-planning.
- In July, a total of 164.9 total training hours were recorded. Training topics included: VFIS driver course for three volunteer firefighters, wall breaching (firefighter survival), introduction to HOLMATRO extrication tools, aerial apparatus skills.
- In August, a total of 238.4 total training hours were recorded.
 Training topics included: Blue Card Incident Command lab with one Chief Officer Certified. Level 1 Firefighter skill stations,
 Confined space equipment, and water rescue equipment.

Fire Prevention & Education Report

- John Malloy assumed the position of Deputy Chief of Fire Prevention on June 13, 2022.
- Planning has commenced for a Fire Prevention week Open House on October 15th at Riverview Fire and Rescue.

Fire Inspections

- There was a total of sixteen (16) fire safety inspection conducted between mid June and end of August, a childcare facility, One residential Day Care, two Apartments for new openings, six (6) schools, one Liquor establishment, One AirBnB, two inspections of dilapidated properties, two complaints of hazardous properties.
- Performed a residential check on residence and preformed a fire safety plan for resident of two autistic children.

Fire Prevention & Education

- Performed three Community Events Touch-A-Truck event and two Block Party events.
- We conducted two tours of the fire station for a group of 4 yr olds and a group of teens. Did two fire truck tours at separate day care centres.
- We conducted a fire station tour for a resident and his children who stopped by the fire station.

Fire Investigation

• There was one fire in a structure in August requiring investigation.
