- Train at least two nights a month

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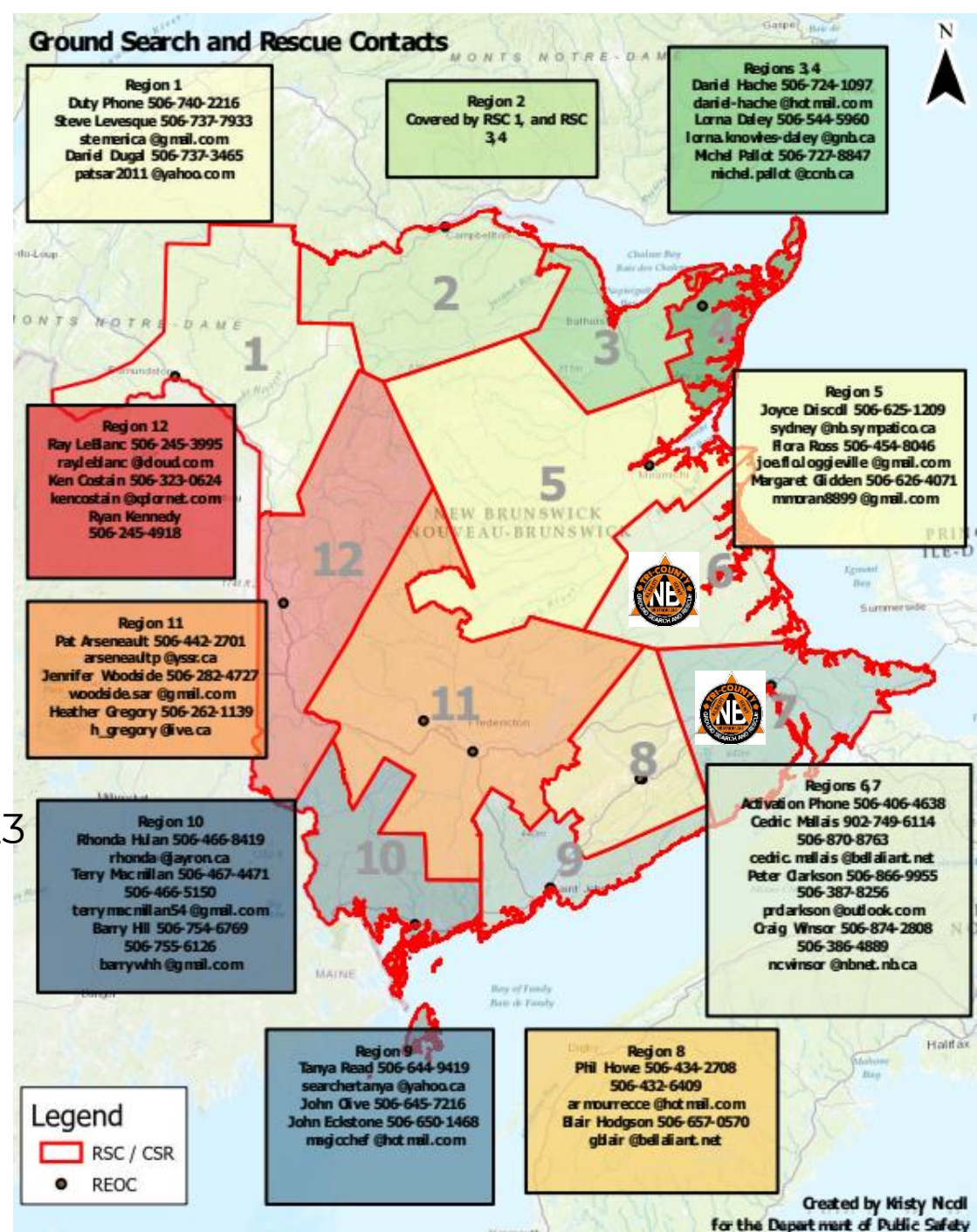

Other Types of Ops

- Evidence Searches supporting the RCMP and municipal police
 - not involving fugitives
- Urban searches
 - Door-to-door



COST OF SERVICE

- 5,800 hours to date 2021 only
- Roughly 45,000 hours Provincially.
- Save the province over \$4.2 million per year
- Freeing up policing resources that can be utilized elsewhere.

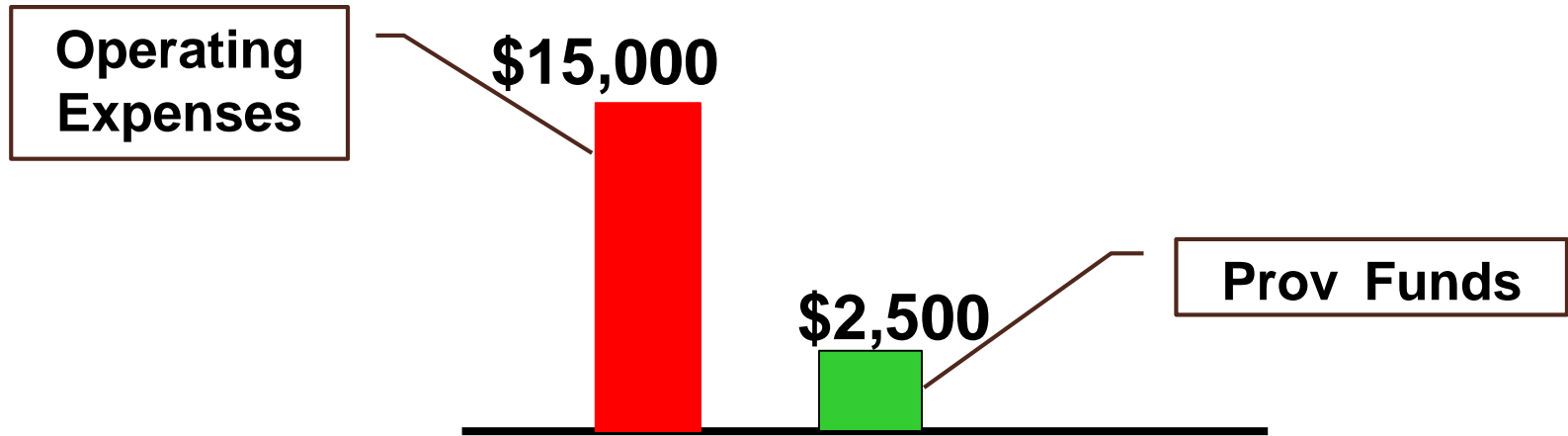

- **Members are reimbursed for travel expenses for a search.**

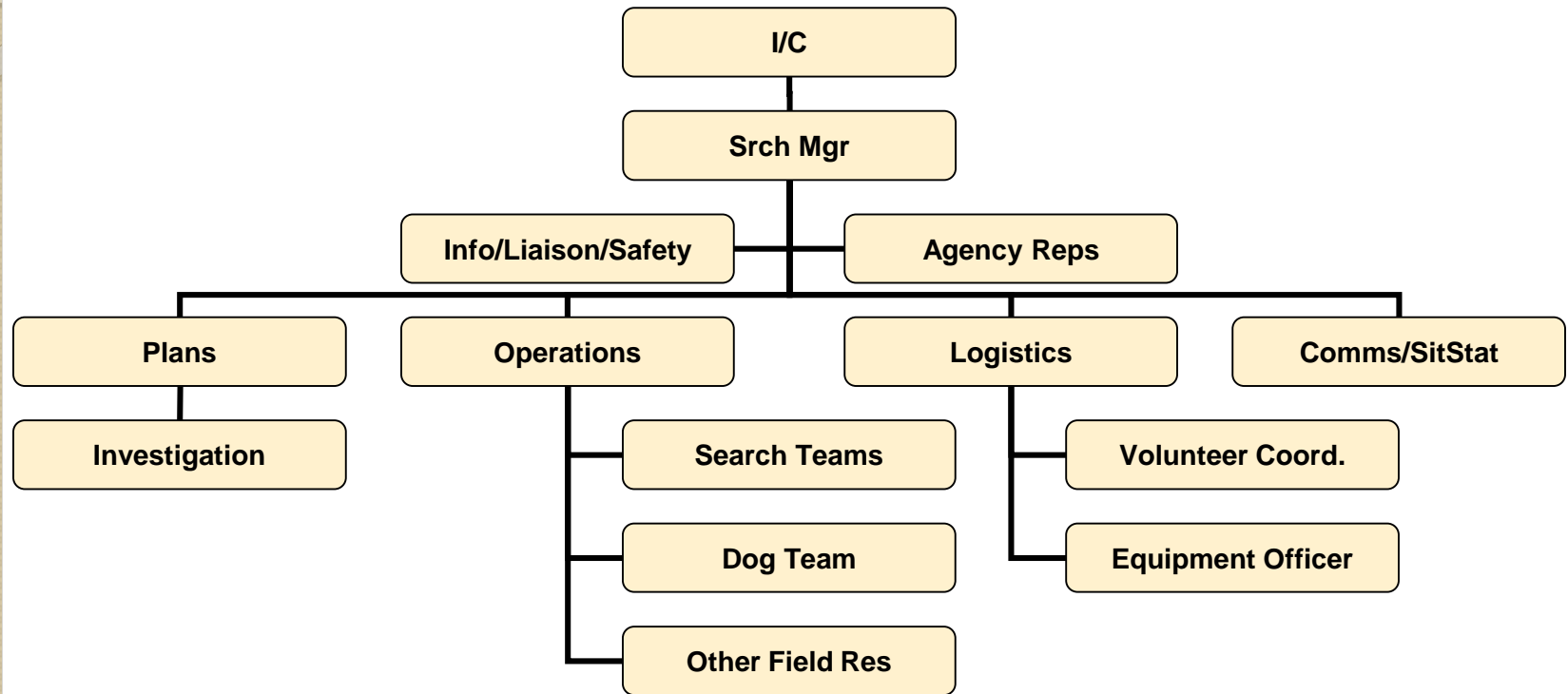


OUR OPERATING BUDGET

- Donations from businesses, communities, and the general public.
- Over 80% of our yearly operating budget is Provided by donations
- Fund-raising events, community contributions
- Provincial Search & Rescue grant monies (\$2,500).
- Contributions provided by the members.
- Funds are used to maintain the mobile command post and equipment



We Use the Incident Command System



The Incident Command System is an accredited system that is trained through all emergency services. This allows us to work integrated seamlessly with the Police, Fire and EMS within EMO's framework.

Mission Critical

- Currently homeless - seeking a garage /training building. We have been relying on the generosity of Municipal resources to hold team meetings.
- Grassroots initiative to begin by getting a piece of land to build our own building
- House the Mobile Command Post and Trailer
- Centrally Located within the Greater Moncton area.
- Current initiatives include entering into the Project Lifesaver International program locating technology that has saved 3,966 lives to date. Cost to *start* this program is \$18,000.
