PATROL – General Duty (GD)

These are the members which you will see the most on a daily basis. Members of Codiac RCMP who patrol the Codiac region 24-hours a day. Daily calls for service range from 100 to 200 per day. Calls for service to patrol include lower level items such as requests for patrols on busy streets and schools and minor thefts to higher level severity crimes including domestic violence, robberies and homicides. Regardless the type of call for service, the first members who will respond will typically always be a patrol member.

Approximately 40,000 calls for service per year.





FURTHER INVESTIGATION TEAM (FIT)

Uniformed members who support Patrol and are a link to other investigative units at Codiac. Files which require more of a follow-up while normally go to FIT. Examples of this includes frauds, where some form of judicial authorization is required. Other files assigned to FIT included sexual assaults, domestic violence and missing person files. FIT also is tasked with daily in-custody prisoners and court.





CALL BACK UNIT (CBU) / FRONT DESK

Members assigned to the Call Back Unit and Front Desk are often the first point of contact for the public that comes to our front counter at the detachment.

Calls for service which are deemed as not requiring an immediate police presence or patrol will typically be sent to CBU. An example of this is a theft of an item from a backyard, where there is no evidence on scene, no video, no suspect or vehicle information. If files need to be investigated further, they will be assigned to patrol. CBU manages thousands of calls per year. CBU and Front Desk staff are also responsible fro conducting countless Sex Offender Registry checks and interviews.





COMMUNITY POLICING UNIT (CPU)

Mission statement

Provide community-policing services within the Codiac region with the objective to reduce victimization. (Reducing victimization = Reducing crimes)

GENERAL INVESTIGATION SECTION (GIS)

Codiac GIS are mandated to conduct quality serious and/or complex incident investigations in collaboration with members of other Codiac units while providing the highest standard of service that promotes safer communities. Codiac GIS provide Victim Support throughout the investigation and Court proceedings by ensuring that the highest investigational standards are maintained throughout the process. Finally, members of the Codiac GIS offer specialised assistance, support and consultation in all aspects of digital forensic evidence processing, firearm recognition, arson investigations as well as assistance in drafting Judicial Authorisations.

- -Shootings, Serious Assault such as stabbing, Robberies

CRIME REDUCTION UNIT (CRU)

The Codiac Crime Reduction is a plain clothes unit that focusses on the offenders which cause the most harm within the community. CRU targets offences such as the sale, possession and production of illegal drugs, persistent property crime, prolific offenders and area also regularly called up to assist with major investigations. CRU is intelligence lead, using the information provided by our Criminal Analysts to strategically target crime and hot spots.

INTEGRATED ENFORCEMENT UNIT (NBIEU)

The Integrated Enforcement Units (IEU's) are a multi-agency approach to combatting drugs, firearms, and organized crime affecting our local communities. The IEU's consists of seven regional units situated across New Brunswick. Their approach is centered on information sharing and the strategic coordination of resources and personnel. This team approach to combatting criminality in New Brunswick is comprised of every police agency in New Brunswick, along with the Department of Justice and Public Safety.

COURT AND RECORDS UNIT

Various entries on PROS, CPIC, etc. Attending Court, documenting results and delivering testimony on Bail Hearings. Prepare a vast array of legal documents. Conclusion of files and overall quality assurance of files.
