Training topics included: CriSys (CAD) system use in vehicles; In-service on new MSA air cart; HAZMAT Emergency Response Guidebook review; Gas detector use; Deploying hose. • The Level 1 firefighter course has completed block 1 and have commenced block 2 (20% complete). • Deputy Malloy completed the JIBC Fire Cause and Origin 3 course and wrote the exam for NFPA 1033 Standard for Professional Qualifications for Fire Investigator. • Seven volunteer firefighters completed the Ice Rescue Technician training. • One volunteer firefighter completed Hazardous Materials Awareness Certification.
