Administration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In relation to EMO, two members of TOR staff took Incident Command System (ICS) 100 and 200 in the month of April. Preparations are in place for an EOC exercise in early May. Chief True attended a regional EMO meeting on behalf of the TOR.

<p>Operations</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Water Rescue Mutual Aid Agreement reviewed with Moncton and Dieppe. Some minor adjustments are being made to reflect the changeover to TMR Radios. • Snowbird Airshow Committee meeting attended by Deputy Fisher. Riverview Fire & Rescue are partnered with Moncton & Dieppe Fire Departments to provide emergency rescue and fire response for the event.
<p>Training</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A total of 339.25 training hours were obtained in the month of April. Training topics included: Blue Card Incident Command; Forestry equipment & procedures; Aerial apparatus skills; water master streams. • Deputy Malloy attended a Display Fireworks and a Pyrotechnician course put on by FireworksFX organized by the Dieppe Fire Department. • Seven firefighters completed swiftwater rescue technician training instructed by members of the department. • Six volunteer firefighters were certified in Workplace Standard First Aid, instructed by members of the department. • Four firefighters obtained their Emergency Firefighter (wildland firefighter) certification from DNRE.
<p>Fire Prevention & Education Report</p>	<p><u>Fire Inspections</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were a total of eighteen (18) fire safety inspections conducted in the month of April, and two inspections of derelict residences for safety reasons prior to demolition. <p><u>Fire Prevention & Education</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were three (3) fire prevention sessions or education tours completed in the month of April. We also held one educational tour of the fire station for a group of adults. • Delivered over 65 Public information releases for residents of an apartment building regarding information while dialing 911. • Worked with TOR Staff to program to complete program for registering homemade fire pits in an online format through the TOR website. <p><u>Fire Investigation</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were no structure fires in the month of April requiring investigation.
