Administration	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Two EMO exercises were conducted with participation of several town staff members.Chief True attended a Regional Emergency Measures meeting on behalf of Riverview.
Operations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Snowbird Airshow Committee meeting attended by the Deputy Chief of Operations. Riverview Fire & Rescue has partnered with Moncton & Dieppe Fire Departments to provide emergency rescue and fire response for the June event.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Probationary Career Firefighters have now moved from Monday – Friday 8-5 shifts to their respective duty shifts. • Deep Cleaning off all apparatus completed during May. • The Standard Operating Guideline (SOG-111), aimed at enhancing station coverage, has been put into effect. Volunteers will now respond during times when career staff are unable to respond for station coverage.
Training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A total of 393 training hours were obtained in the month of May. Training topics included: Hose line deployment and advancement; Auto Extrication; Live fire evolutions; Various core firefighter Level 1 skills. • Riverview hosted a mutual aid live-fire training session on May 13th with twenty firefighters in attendance from Riverview, Hillsborough, Salisbury and Riverside-Albert. • Two Chief Officers completed an elevator emergency evacuation course. • Two career and two three volunteer firefighters obtained certification in Aerial Apparatus Operations. • Four volunteer firefighters obtained certification in the NB Basic Wildland Firefighting Course. • Two career members completed a 3-day course on Hose and Nozzle Operations (<i>Nozzle Forward Program</i>). • One volunteer firefighter completed written testing towards their Hazardous Materials Operations certification.
