Administration	• An information session for the 2023 Volunteer Firefighter recruitment
	was hosted. Over 20 potential candidates attended. The recruitment process will continue into November.
	• Planning commenced in conjunction with Parks & Recreation for the

Operations • Engine 11 has been sent to Metalfab (truck manufacturer) for body repairs, which will result in the apparatus being out of service for several weeks. • RFR has taken receipt of a new Alt-Air 5X gas detector, completing Capital Project #23-21. • Calls for commercial fire alarms (non-malicious) continue to trend upwards in 2023 compared to previous years. **Training** • A total of 439 total training hours were completed in October, with topics including: Responding to chimney fires; CPR; Lockout /Tagout procedures; High rise firefighting operations. • Training was completed on new equipment that will allow firefighters to hook into a building's stand-pipe system. This training is important as the number of apartment buildings grow within Riverview. • Eighteen career firefighters recertified in Basic Life Support (CPR). Two career firefighters certified as Confined Space Rescue instructors. • Eight volunteer firefighters participated in a pump operator course. • One career officer completed an Incident Command System ICS 300 course. Fire Prevention & Fire Inspections **Education Report** • There was a total of nine (9) fire safety inspections conducted in the month of October, with eight being in apartment buildings and one being commercial occupancy. Performed occupancy level and pre-plan for a building. Worked on a Fire /Building Code request as well as actioned a request through AccessE11 for a fire pit registry. Fire Prevention & Education • There were three (3) fire truck tours completed, with one at a school and two at daycares. • There were five (5) fire station tours in the month of October. • There was a Fire Department Open House with several hundred in attendance.

Fire Investigation

• There was one structural fire in the month of October, requiring investigation.

• Applied to the Province of New Brunswick to obtain smoke detectors as well as carbon monoxide alarms as part of a fire safety campaign.
