Operations • The department took possession of two pedal bikes (fat bikes) to assist in reducing the time required to locate and treat patients for incidents that occur along various trail systems in our coverage area. • The department is hosting another with a Student from Riverview High School as part of the Student Co-Op Program with the new term starting in February. **Training** • A total of 532.75 hrs of training were recorded in February, with topics including: Rope rescue operations, SCBA air management, confined space entry, facility tour of Shannex and a reading smoke presentation. • Ten firefighters obtained certifications in Rope Rescue Operations. • Sixteen firefighters obtained certifications in Confined Space Entry. • Block 1 of the NBCC Firefighter level 1 course continues with six students. • Riverview Fire & Rescue hosted students from Oulton College for two days of vehicle extrication training, involving both firefighters and paramedic students. Fire Prevention & Fire Inspections **Education Report** • There was a total of fifteen (15) fire safety inspections conducted in February, one daycare, ten restaurants, two gas stations, one auto parts store and one auto repair facility. Fire Prevention & Education • There was one fire prevention session at the fire station for Sea Cadets receiving an educational lecture and a fire station tour. Fire Investigation • There were no fires in February requiring investigation.
