Administration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Fire Chief has commenced work on a Community Risk Assessment, being completed from a fire and rescue perspective (25% complete). With the latest ICS 200 course completed in March with Parks and Recreation staff, the TOR has twenty-six staff members with a minimum of ICS 200 training.
Operations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Capital Project 24-25, Purchase and Install of Turn-Out Gear Lockers within the fire station was completed.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two new career firefighters filled new positions in March. Once their training is complete, the staffing complement on two out of four shifts will transition to six career firefighters.
Training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A total of 228.5 total training hours were accumulated, including the following topics: Pre-planning tour of the new Kent on Finlay Blvd.; Building construction-engineered building components; Several skills stations related to new career firefighter orientation. • Four firefighters were certified as Ice Rescue Technicians, and one Deputy Chief certified in Ice Rescue Operations. • Orientation training for two new career firefighters approximately 50% complete. • Volunteer Firefighter level 1 recruit class nearing completion of Block 1. (15% course completion).
Fire Prevention & Education Report	<p><u>Fire Inspections</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There was a total of twenty-two (22) fire safety inspection conducted in March including fifteen daycares, two restaurants, four nursing homes, and one business. <p><u>Fire Prevention & Education</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There was one fire station tour in the month of March. <p><u>Fire Investigation</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There was one residential structure fire in March requiring investigation. <p><u>Complaint Investigations</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were four public inquiries related to properties which were actioned by the Deputy Chief of Fire Prevention.
