Administration	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Community Risk Assessment exercise was conducted on May 1, which was chaired by CAO Colin Smith.
Operations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Two new medications were placed into service for use by our Paramedic trained medical first responders. There are now fourteen medications that can be administered by our first responders prior to the arrival of an ambulance.Current Volunteer Roster: 21 of 28 spots filled. Fourteen are Level 1 Trained or higher (50%), Five are enrolled in Level 1 Training (18%), 2 are enrolled in RFR Logbook Skills (7%) and seven

	vacancies exist (25%) with a recruitment drive planned for fall 2024.
Training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A total of 235.25 hrs of training were recorded in May, including: Wildland urban interface structural triage; Emergency scene traffic control; Rope rescue systems. • Five Firefighter Level 1 students have completed 40% of their course. • Fourteen career members were certified in ARGO operations. • Three volunteer members recertified as Medical First Responders.
Fire Prevention & Education Report	<p><u>Fire Inspections</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There was a total of fifteen (15) fire safety inspections conducted in May. There was one business inspected (with an occupancy load requirement) as well as eleven apartment buildings, one senior's apartment and two private schools. <p><u>Fire Prevention & Education</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There was a total of two fire station tours with educational presentations conducted in the month of May. • There was a <i>Fire Smart</i> Prep Day presentation on May 4 with approximately 20 residents in attendance. This session assisted residents with preparing for wildland-urban interface fires. • There was a media interview conducted regarding the Wildland Urban Interface <i>Fire Smart</i> Prep Day. There were two media interviews regarding our ARGO and Off-Road Rescue operations. • Riverview Fire & Rescue's Facebook page now has 3,971 followers. <p><u>Fire Investigation</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were two fires in May requiring investigation.
