



### Sponsor a Child to Read with "The Imagination Library"

#### The Program

"The Imagination Library" is a family literacy program that provides preschool children with a new, ageappropriate book every month—FREE! It is open to all children from birth to their fifth birthday, and ensures that children have quality books to enjoy at home.

The Imagination Library promotes and encourages a love of reading and helps ensure that children have an opportunity to enter kindergarten with a strong foundation in literacy and an eagerness to learn. Reading to a child early often improves their ability to succeed right from start of their formal education.

Registration forms are made available to families through daycares, community centres, health care centres and schools.

#### History of the Program

In 2009, the Anglophone East School District (formerly School District 2) and the Moncton Regional Learning Council came together to develop a program to support early childhood literacy in our community. Through the recommendations of a retired Port Elgin early-years teacher, "The Imagination Library" was approached to provide books for pre-kindergarten children in our District. To-date, more than 500 children in Southeast New Brunswick receive, at no cost, books that are chosen carefully in keeping with the following fundamental themes: love of reading and learning; regard for diversity of people, their roles, culture and environment, promotion of self esteem and confidence; and the appreciation of art and aesthetics.

The program is sponsored in part by local rotaries, health care foundations and other local service clubs, as well as local businesses and caring individuals.

It is currently available to children in the following Greater Moncton school catchment areas: Beaverbrook, Forest Glen, Birchmount, Edith Cavell, Queen Elizabeth and Lou MacNarin. It is also available in several rural communities, including Port Elgin, Dorchester, Riverside Albert, Hillsborough, Petitcodiac, Salisbury and Havelock.

The Imagination Library was founded by Dolly Parton in 1996 and expanded to Canada in 2006. They now distribute more than 580,000 books world wide every month.

#### **Our Goal**

Knowing that early literacy is one of the most effective ways to improve the educational opportunities for children in any community, it is our goal to grow and serve more children in **your** community.

To achieve this goal we need your help.

#### Imagination Library Sponsorship

It costs only \$63.00 a year to provide a book once a month to a child in your community. If a child is registered for the Imagination Library at birth, they will have a 60 book library by the time they enter Kindergarten!

Every dollar donated to the Imagination Library goes directly to cover the cost of books and their mailing. Anglophone East School District and the Moncton Regional Learning Council cover all administrative and promotional costs, so you know your contribution is making a difference to children in your community.

#### **Riverview Schools Cost Analysis**


As word of the Imagination Library program spreads in the community, a higher percentage of students enroll each year. The following figures are based on estimates, using a standard formula of enrollment based on experiences in other communities.


#### The Program



The Imagination Library was founded by Dolly Parton in 1996 in her home state of Tennessee. She wanted every preschool child to have their own library of books, knowing that early literacy is one of the most effective ways to improve the educational opportunities for children in any community.

The program now runs in almost 2,000 communities in the United States, Canada, Australia and United Kingdom.

Books are chosen carefully in keeping with the following fundamental themes: love of reading and learning; regard for diversity of people, their roles, culture and environment; promotion of self esteem and confidence; and the appreciation of art and aesthetics.

#### Who Is Eligible?

Any child aged 0 to 4 who is a resident of the one of the following school catchment area:

- Riverside Consolidated School
- Hillsborough Elementary School



### What Are My Responsibilities?

- Be a legal resident of the school catchment area.
- Submit this official registration form, completely filled out by parent or guardian (form must be approved and on file with ASD-F)
- Books are mailed only to the address listed on the official registration form. Your child will begin to receive books 8-10 weeks after your registration form has been received and will continue until your child's fifth birthday.
- Read with your child, and enjoy books together every day!

Should your child's address change, you must contact the Anglophone East School District. Your child may continue to receive books as long as he/she resides in one of the designated catchment areas.

1. How did you first hear about the Imagination Library?

"I heard through a Rotarian member."

2. What happens at your house when the book arrives?

"We make a little trip down the street to the mailbox. They open the mailbox with the key and see that they have books. They get all excited and love receiving books. The days that I would go to the mail in the morning, they would look at them in the car on their way to the daycare."

3. Have the books made a difference in your child's interest in reading and if so in what way?

"I think that the Imagination Library has definitely made a difference in my children's interest in reading. They are very attracted to the images, the multicultural stories and the different subjects addressed in the books, which are all things that I would not have thought of looking for when buying a book myself.

4. On average, how many times would you read each book with your child?

"We read all books at least a few times; however, we read the books they love the most at least 50 to 60 times."

#### 1. How did you first hear about the Imagination Library?

"My wife heard of the Imagination Library through the local library."

#### 2. What happens at your house when the book arrives?

"When I come home, I check the mail. If the books are there, I go home and tell my three year old to walk with me to the mail. It's a big deal for her as she gets to pick up her book and her younger sister's book. She loves the fact that her name is on the package and that she has a new book to read. As soon as we get home, we write their name and the date that it came in. Afterwards, the entire family sits down together and reads the two new books."

#### 3. Have the books made a difference in your child's interest in reading and if so in what way?

"Since our daughter was nine months old, she has always loved books more than toys. Her true interest is books; therefore, she is very happy to receive a new book to read every month. As a matter of fact, she will memorize the books, and pretend to read them to us. We have quite an extensive library at home, and although the program might not specifically be the reason why she loves reading, it adds new books in her library, which helps her grow even more."

#### 4. On average, how many times would you read each book with your child?

"The first week after the reception of the books, we read them 2-4 times per day. Afterwards, we probably keep on reading the books tree (3) times per week until the next one shows up."
