## **Professional Development**

Several staff members attended the Resiliency Workshop January 16<sup>th</sup>. The Moncton Chapter of Chartered Professionals in Human Resources hosted this event. Dr. Bill Howatt presented the topic of Building a High Performing, Resilient Workforce in the Face of Change. Dr. Howatt is known as one of Canada's top experts in mental health issues in the workplace. To successfully navigate today's pace of change, organizations need to better understand the impact of change on employee's mental, physical, life, and work health, and the critical connection between an individual's coping skills and resiliency with their performance in the workplace.
