# Section 4: Other Notable Development & Highlights for Council's Attention: Updated by Michel Ouellet

**Department Servicing Charges** – In order to be consistent with other department services charged after normal working hours, we are proposing to introduce a charge when being requested by a house builder to conduct a "service inspection" outside regular hours. Currently, we charge \$150 if asked to operate a water turn-on or off outside of regular hours. The charge of \$150 will only apply if a house builder insists we conduct the service inspection outside regular hours. The same task will continue to be free during regular hours. House builders will be informed by staff when receiving the call to work outside regular hours.

**SERSC Solid Waste** – The Director is a member of the Solid Waste Technical Committee. The Committee meets once per month. At the last meeting on March 28, we discussed the design layout of the new on-site Eco-Depot, they introduced their new communication officer for the SERSC, and uptake at the mobile Eco-Depot sites continues to be strong. A new gas collection generator is working well and has saved the commission \$250,000 in electricity by reselling electricity it generates back to NB Power.

**Professional Development** – The engineering department attended a webinar on the "Introduction to Steel Reinforced Polyethylene Pipe for Storm and Sanitary Sewer Applications". The Department continues to research new products to ensure staff are familiar with the latest products in the industry and seeks to provide the highest of technical standards for the community.

**GIS / Asset Management Service** – The Department is completing the last of the 2017 as-built updates in order to provide the information to launch the new GIS database provided by the Southeast Regional Service Commission (SERSC).

**Management of Natural Assets** – The first workshop between members of the Smart Prosperity Institute (SPI), SERSC staff and member from Riverview will occur on May 23, 2018.
