Subject: Storm water Study Recommendations



**BACKGROUND** A storm event that took place on May 25th, 2016, saw approximately 85mm of rainfall over a 120 minute period. Basement and surface flooding was reported in the McAllister Park Subdivision, primarily on Hebron Street, Berkley Drive, McAllister Road and Grindstone Drive. We were asked by Council to investigate and find solutions to reduce the risk in the future of flooding residential basements. In 2017 following issuance of an RFP, the Department engaged WSP Canada Inc. to perform a storm water study for four separate areas (McAllister, Point Park, Byron/Balmoral and Bridgedale) within the Town limits, presenting various issues and possessing various future design needs. The consultant report include preliminary cost estimates and priority sequencing.

<u>Financial</u>: The study highlighted 26 recommendations for a total of almost \$5.3M. Two recommendations are already part of the 2018 Capital for a value of \$460k. 12 recommendations are able to be combined with other work on the street to create a saving (restoration and engineering) of \$1M. 6 recommendations involving placements of ICDs and storm water storage improvements can be done by PW for a total savings of \$100k. A total of 18 recommendations have been added to the 10 yr Capital Transportation Plan for a total \$3.7M. All projects are being proposed between 2019 and 2029.
