History

Greater Moncton Immigration Strategy developed and implemented beginning June 2014 (18 key objectives), LIP was a high priority in this Strategy.



• Greater Moncton Local Immigration Partnership (LIP) is a community development initiative which officially began in September 2015.



First agreement was provided to the City of Moncton



 Funded by Immigration Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) it is one of several LIP initiatives established in municipalities across Canada. In June 2017 there were 77 in total.



Benefits as a result of municipality holding the agreement:

- ✓ Reception space,
- ✓ Translation, access to media and expertise, strategic planning for action plans,.... etc., and municipal services, ability to bring people to the table

The project has two main research goals: 1. To identify and assess the services available to newcomers for integration into the community whether traditional community based, ethnocultural associations, municipal based, or provincial based services that help create a welcome community. This is not focused on primary immigrant services but on community services. These services include but are not limited: places of faith, ethno-cultural associations, recreational, cultural and artistic programs and venues, service clubs, volunteer organizations, public libraries, community agencies; 2. To identify the existing gaps in service in the Greater Moncton immigration ecosystem for welcoming communities.
