	Two new career firefighters filled new positions in March. Once their training is complete, the staffing complement on two out of four shifts will transition to six career firefighters.	
Training	 A total of 228.5 total training hours were accumulated, including the following topics: Pre-planning tour of the new Kent on Finlay Blvd.; Building construction-engineered building components; Several skills stations related to new career firefighter orientation. Four firefighters were certified as Ice Rescue Technicians, and one Deputy Chief certified in Ice Rescue Operations. Orientation training for two new career firefighters approximately 50% complete.
